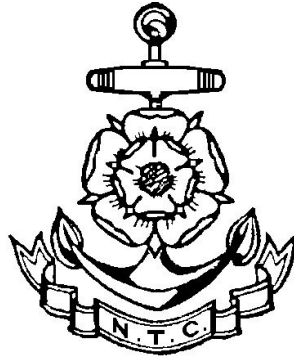

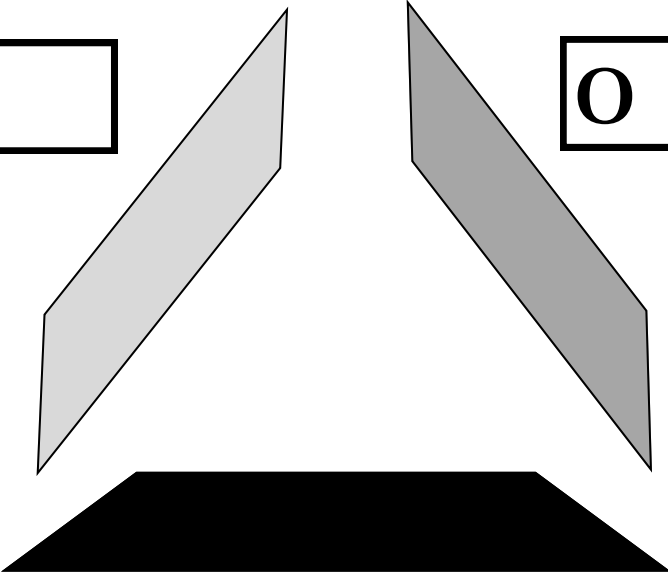

North Mark

Placed between NW and NE of the obstacle.

Colour: black above yellow.

Topmark: two black cones with their tips upward.

Light: a continuous quick or very quick flashing.

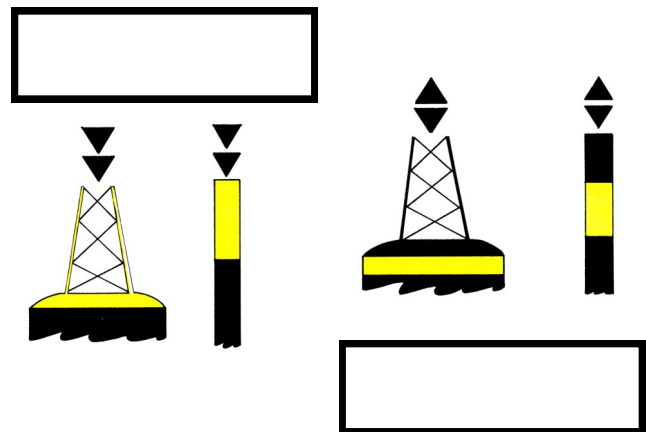
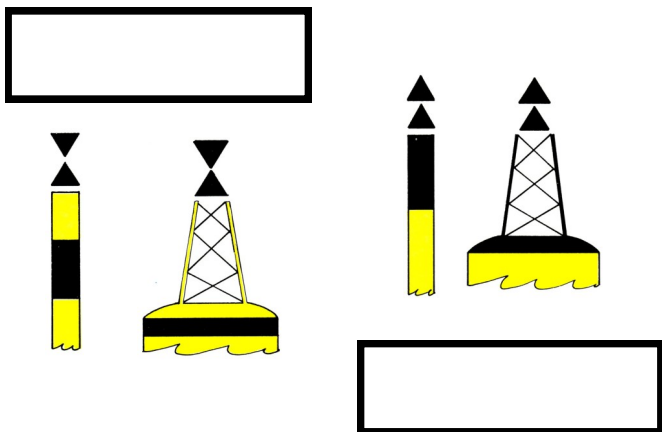
East Mark

Lies NE—SE of the obstacle.

Colour: black with a wide yellow midband.

Topmark: two black cones with tips pointing away from each other.

Light: (very) quick flashing in groups of three.



West Mark

Lies SW—NW of the obstacle.

Colour: yellow with a wide black midband.

Topmark: two black cones with tips pointing toward each other.

Light: quick or very quick flashing in groups of nine.

South Mark

Lies SE—SW of the obstacle.

Colour: yellow part above black part.

Topmark: two black cones with tips downward.

Light: (very) quick flashing in groups of six short followed by one long flash..







